Use the following as a guide to completing the non-Education requirements for your BEd:

- Teachable Subject Area 8 courses (24 units)
- Foundational Areas- 1 course in each of 6 areas (18 units)
- Electives 5 courses (15 units)
- > Tip: Stay organized: Plan early, check with advisors, and confirm transferability before paying fees or registering

Start Here

- Run your Academic Requirements Report (Student Centre > Program & Advising) for missing courses
- Review the institution's course catalogue and schedule
- Check delivery (in-person/online; synchronous/asynchronous; paced/self-paced)
- Confirm credit weighting and course level/coding
- Review prerequisites, antirequisites, and restrictions
- Transfer credit rulings can change use the Transfer Credit Search Tool
- Make sure it is **not a duplicate** of credit you already hold
- → Tip: Always confirm the latest offerings in the institution's course catalogue for up-to-date information.

Avoiding Duplicates & Restrictions

- A course can fulfill only one requirement (e.g., ENGL 251 counts as either Foundational or Elective)
- No credit is given for courses equivalent to one you already hold, or to their antirequisites (e.g., MATH 265 or its antirequisite MATH 249)
- → Tip: Use extra caution if taking courses from multiple institutions.

Before You Register

Talk to an Advisor – Email planned courses to upe@ucalgary.ca at least 2-weeks before the LoP deadlines

When emailing upe@ucalgary.ca, include:

- UCID number
- Intended semester of enrolment
- Institution name
- Course code(s) and title(s)
- Anticipated UCalgary equivalent(s)
- Degree requirement(s) the course will fulfill:
 - o Example: Northern Lakes College, ENGL 1000 = ENGL 203, literature foundational
- Submit your Letter of Permission (LoP), then email upe@ucalgary.ca to let us know
- LoP Deadlines:

October 15 – Winter March 1 – Spring/Summer June 15 – Fall

- Wait for approval do not enroll until your LoP is formally approved (you'll receive an approval email with the LoP attached).
- Report changes to upe@ucalgary.ca if you drop or swap a course.

Taking the Course(s)

It is your responsibility to...

- Apply & Register You must apply directly to the external institution.
- Pay all Fees You are responsible for tuition and any related fees.

After Completion

- Order official transcripts sent directly to transcripts@ucalgary.ca by August 1 for transfer credit.
- Check your Transfer Credit Report around 2 weeks after requesting transcripts; email upe@ucalgary.ca if your credit isn't posted
