UPE course connections (not exhaustive)	 EDUC 435: Literacy, Language and Culture This course is about the importance of reading, writing, speaking, listening, viewing, and representing. In this lesson grade 2-5 students learn how visual art can tell a story, and how to use mixed media to represent their learning and share their story. EDUC 460: Specialization: Language arts (Elem), Integrated art Preservice teachers learn about literacy and comprehension. Also integrate art for students to demonstrate their learning. In this lesson plan students use art to display their understanding of what they are learning and use speaking skills to present to the class about their piece of mixed media.
	EDUC 530: Interdisciplinary Preservice teachers are introduced to creating integrated ideas to demonstrate the connection between learning and knowledge in subject areas to support learning and comprehension. In this lesson Grade 2- 5 students create an interdisciplinary project that includes Language Arts, Reading, Writing, representing, viewing, speaking, listening and creation of a Mixed Media visual art piece that demonstrates their learning and understanding.

Rationale	Big idea: Students will explore the text and create an original composition (mixed media) based on topics they are learning about in school.Purpose: Students use visual art to represent their learning and understanding of topics.		
Lesson/activities	 Before starting this lesson, the teacher creates a PowerPoint about the author/ artist (George Littlechild) and includes a description of "Mix Media". What it is and examples. Include in the description of Mix Media that there is no single path to follow and instead different layers that student could explore as the students so choose Layer 1*: adhesive and collage (optional- depends on what the students wants to start with)- Note: this can help texture Layer 1: paint layer Layer 2: art crayon/pencil Layer 3: Adhesive layer Layer 5: Adhesive/sealer https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JE33nt13sbl https://vimeo.com/112845781 To begin this lesson, introduce and read George Littlechild's book This Land is My Land. Discuss George Littlechild's artwork in the book. What message is the artwork conveying? What is happening in the art piece? What emotions do you feel when you look at this piece of art? What materials does George 		

Littlechild use? 4. Students will create an original mixed media art piece.
 Optional Topics can include (this can depend on the topic and grade of students): Grade 1 and 2: Community: family, home, school, city, country- symbols that represent each community Grade 3 and 4: Rights of a Child: Choose one of the UN Rights of a Child to visually represent Grade 5: Current events: What social issues or topics are you passionate about and visually represent them: ex. pollution, animal safety, etc. Have students present their Mixed media art piece to the class answering these questions:
 What inspired your art piece? Why did you choose the topic? What materials did you use? Why did you use them? Describe the process used to create the installation? (Grade 5- why is this an important issue for you?)
 Assessment: (appendix 1): Have students fill out the Tag Feedback for their peers: Tell the artist something you like, ask a question, give a suggestion. (<u>https://www.edutopia.org/video/60-second-strategy-tag-feed back</u>) Example of Mixed Media below for your reference.
